

Rules of Conduct at City Facilities in Section 7 of Urgency Ordinance

Section 7. Rules of Conduct at City Facilities. It is hereby ordered and ordained that the following rules shall apply for the use of the City facilities, as defined herein:

7.1 City Facility For purposes of this Urgency Ordinance, the term “City Facility” or “City Facilities” means City Hall, Police Department lobby, Public Works Department lobby, Main Harrison Library and Park Branch Library.

7.2 Vaccination against COVID-19. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in a City Facility at any time unless that person has been fully vaccinated against COVID-19. The term “fully vaccinated” means the person has been vaccinated against COVID-19 and received a booster. Persons shall not be permitted to enter a City Facility unless they first present proof to an authorized City employee that they are fully vaccinated.

7.3 Face Covering. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in City Facility at any time unless that person wears a face covering both the mouth and nose at all times. Upon request, the City will provide anyone seeking to enter City Facility with a face covering if they do not have one.

7.4. Attendance at Meetings at City Hall.

7.4.1 Persons who wish to attend a meeting at City Hall of the City Council and any Boards or Commissions of the City must comply with the vaccination and face covering requirements in this Section 7

7.4.2 If anyone is unable or unwilling to comply with the requirements of this Section 7, they may attend the meeting remotely in the manner described in the Agenda posted for the meeting.

7.4.3 Due to the size of the City Council chambers, and in order to maintain social distancing, 11 members of the

public will be allowed in the Chamber at any one time with seats being available on a first come first served basis.

All others will need to wait outside of the building for their turn to speak during public comments or they may instead attend the meeting remotely.
